## Dressing Gown from squares

## version 1

- Our example makes a dressing gown that will fit most people.

You can make slightly smaller or larger versions.

- Our standard pattern is based on 12 cm squares $\qquad$
- The squares can be knitted or crocheted
- Our samples were made in double knitting on a 4 mm needle or crochet hook. Do not use a yarn thicker than double knitting, in case the garment gets too heavy.


## Back



Knit or crochet a belt 6 cm wide by 180-200 cm long.

## Seams

You may decide to make the seams a decorative feature by using a contrasting colour, or you may decide to sew up using the same colour.

## Joining

## Making up the body:

Join seams A + B together and C + D together Making up the sleeves:
Join seams E + F together and $\mathrm{G}+\mathrm{H}$ together.

## Edging

You can add a crochet border (double or treble crochet) around all the edges - neck, front opening, hem, cuffs.

## Details

You can add a pocket and a belt if you wish.

## Smoking Jacket version 2 (shorter length)

To make a shorter smoking jacket work 3 squares ( 36 cm ) from hem to arm hole not 6 .
