

A simple pattern for a hat and scarf

You will need:

100 grams of chunky-weight yarn for the hat and something to decorate it. 200 grams of chunky weight wool for the scarf, or more if you would like it to be longer than 165cm.

6mm knitting needles, either straight or circular.

A very large-eyed needle for sewing in ends of yarn.

Some yarn that is finer than chunky for sewing up the hat. A card of darning yarn is ideal.

The hat

Cast on 37 stitches fairly loosely on 6mm needles. Knit every row until the piece of work is 50cm long. Cast off fairly loosely.

The scarf

Cast on 30 stitches fairly loosely on 6mm needles. Knit every row until almost all of the yarn is knitted. Cast off fairly loosely.

To make up

Darn in the ends of the hat strip.

Fold the piece so that the cast on and cast off edges are on top of each other. Sew up the side seams. Then bring the two points at the top of each side seam together and stitch them to the knitting at the centre of the imaginary line joining them. Decorate your hat as you wish. Darn in the ends of the scarf strip.
